Kiener Plaza: A City Park in the Heart of Downtown

Featuring native Missouri plants, a bistro area, splash pad, and a children's play area

ateway Arch Park Foundation's mission is to maintain Gateway Arch National Park and the neighboring public spaces from Kiener Plaza to the Riverfront. The CityArchRiver Project transformed Kiener Plaza into a beautiful gathering place in the heart of Downtown St. Louis that caters to commuters, city visitors, and families.

Kiener Plaza is a St. Louis City Park that features paths around garden beds filled with Missouri native plants, flowers, and trees, a lawn that can accommodate a variety of events, a bicycle parking grove, a bistro area with café tables and chairs, benches, a fountain garden with a splash pad, and a children's play garden, as well as a statue in honor of the former Olympian, Harry Kiener, a USA Track & Field member who competed at the 1904 Olympics, eventually becoming a steel company executive and philanthropist.

New Improvements Coming Soon to Kiener Plaza

A new Visitor Services & Maintenance Building is coming to Kiener Plaza. The building will include a workspace for on-site security and provide storage and support space for events and maintenance. This project is a collaboration with our partners, Great Rivers Greenway, Explore St. Louis, and Jefferson National Parks Association to provide visitor information and shopping for St. Louis themed-gifts. Work on the new building is expected to be complete by Fall 2021.

Kiener Plaza was built as a memorial to Harry J. Kiener (1881-1960), an amateur sportsman and member of the **USA Track & Field** team at the 1904 Olympics, held in St. Louis in 1904 during the World's Fair. The Plaza's centerpiece is a pool and fountain containing a statue known as "The Runner" by Lithuanian-born immigrant William Zorach to honor the former Olympian. The 1904 Summer Olympics, officially known as the Games of the III Olympiad, were held at what is now known as Francis Field on the campus of Washington University in St. Louis. This was the first time that the **Olympic Games**

were held outside

Europe.

Introducing Tarona Armstrong

Deputy Superintendent, Gateway Arch National Park

Greetings Gateway Arch Park Foundation Supporters and friends,

My name is Tarona Armstrong, Deputy
Superintendent at Gateway Arch National Park. I
relocated to St. Louis at the end of December from
President William Jefferson Clinton Birthplace Home
National Historic Site in Hope, Arkansas, where I
served as the Superintendent since 2014.

It is an honor to join the team that has been entrusted with the responsibility of preserving and leading such an iconic park that reflects St. Louis' role in the westward expansion of the United States, which includes St. Louis' Old Courthouse — the site of hundreds of suits for freedom and the first two trials of the pivotal Dred Scott case in 1847 and 1850. It was also where Virginia Minor's case for a woman's right to vote came to trial in the 1870s.

Although I've been here at the Gateway Arch for only a few months, my career with the National Park Service started nearly 30 years ago. I've had the privilege of working at many historic sites and parks, including assisting in the development of three new units of the NPS (Brown v. Board of Education National Historic Site in Topeka, Kansas; Little Rock Central High School National Historic Site in Little Rock; and President William Jefferson Clinton

Birthplace Home National Historic Site.) My NPS career has taken me across the country, including George Washington Birthplace National Monument in Virginia; Thomas Stone National Historic Site in Charles County, Maryland; and Everglades National Park in Florida.

I am eager now to work alongside the world-class park staff, partners, local community, and supporters that help maintain and sustain Gateway Arch National Park. The Gateway Arch is open for visitors and there is plenty of room to safely enjoy the 91-acre park, the newly redesigned museum, and the 630-foot view from the top. I invite you to come see us this summer.

10 Facts About the Gateway Arch

1. The Gateway Arch turns 56, October 28, 2021.

2. Construction finally began on February 12, 1963, and was completed on October 28, 1965.

3. Finnish architect Eero Saarinen won the international design competition with the Arch design.

4. The arch is as tall as it is wide. The shape is known as a catenary curve and stands 630 feet tall and 630 feet wide.

5. The Arch's two legs were built separately, and if their measurements were off by as little as 1/64th of an inch, they would not have been able to join at the top.

6. The Tram Ride to the Top was designed by Dick Bowser. It took him two weeks to come up with the concept that is part elevator and part Ferris wheel.

7. There are 1,076 steps leading to the top of the Arch.
By comparison, the Washington
Monument has 897, and the Statue of
Liberty has 162.
